Dear Kuranda Paper,

I read with interest the Forest Forum column by the "Fossils" in the August edition of your paper in which a number of Kuranda venues/ organisations including the Amphitheatre were described as "moribund or faltering".

Whilst some points made in column with regards to the reliance on volunteers and the call for Kuranda residents to support their local resources are well made I think that the writer/s are not well informed of the Kuranda Amphitheatre Society's recent activities.

The venue was recently described by a reviewer in the Tablelands Advertiser as "one of the best venues in the country". A member of the John Butler Trio not only complimented the venue but also heaped praises the friendliness of volunteer staff he encountered whilst playing here on August 10th.

The venue would not operate without the input of the volunteer committee who give many hours each week plus the dedicated staff who man the bar, kitchen, tea stall, merchandise stand, soft drink stall, bag search, road closure, gatehouse, ID band staff, clean up crew and community liaison personnel when we host mainstage events. Most of our 100+ volunteers for mainstage events give between 2-3 hours of their time per event but there are also many who give countless additional hours prior to, on the day off and after an event.

This is why various authorities, eg Liquor Licensing, point out the Amphitheatre as being a model community volunteer organisation for our ability to operate in an ever changing and challenging legislative environment.

Things are rather weird in Weir Road these days. Telecom in May put underground lines to one side of the street. Approximately one month later, Ergon advised "work...to install underground cables in Weir Road to allow removal of poles and wires from world heritage rainforest" was to be undertaken. Science and innovation in Barron River were put under the microscope when Member for Barron River Mr Steve Wettenhall met with Dr Miriam Goosem, Research Fellow at the Australian Tropical Forest Institute, James Cook University of North Queensland as part of Science in Parliament 2007.

Science in Parliament is an annual bipartisan event that brings Queensland scientists and innovators together with Members of Parliament to discuss science challenges and opportunities facing our State.

Themed 'Celebrating success in Queensland science', this year's event featured a scientist or innovator from each electorate who has delivered economic, social or environmental benefits to their region.

Dr Goosem met with the Member for Barron River at Parliament House to discuss "Rainforest CRC".

Researchers at the CRC for Tropical Rainforest Ecology and Management (Rainforest CRC), have proven that road underpasses and canopy bridges that allow animals to safely cross roads can reduce road kill and help animals

move around the landscape.

Previously, each year about 3,000 animals were killed by cars on every kilometre of a highway through rainforest near Cairns. Additionally, road barriers also create habitat fragmentation: isolating animal populations, probably causing in-breeding and, in extreme cases, threatening extinction.

Using sophisticated sensors, automatic cameras and footprint tracking, researchers monitored animal traffic and found that tree canopy bridges using rope ladders and specially-designed tunnels under the road that protect animals from predators enable native rainforest wildlife to move between fragmented areas. As part of the Marine and Tropical Sciences Research Facility, they are now assessing longer canopy bridges and aim to examine more underpass designs soon.





Member for Barron River, Steve Wettenhall, has congratulated a local state school for becoming a finalist in the Showcase Awards for Excellence in Schools 2007, Queensland's most prestigious educational accolade.

Mr Wettenhall said Kuranda District State College was among 26 finalists chosen from more than 100 entries in the Showcase Awards, highlighting outstanding educational achievements in Queensland's state schools.

Garden Jottings by Alectura

Things to consider this month: Hopefully with official Spring we will see the temperatures creeping up and the emergence of new shoots on plants cold struck or dormant. With the emergence of new growth on Heliconias and Gingers, time to clean away flowered stems and last year's old growth. Also a good time to divide and replant clumps as forward growths are easily spotted. Water in well with fertilizer .to establish quickly. Find spots for Aristolocia tagala, the host plant for the Cairns Birdwing butterfly. Several should be planted in various spots around the garden as the larvae can quickly defoliate the vine. Plant of the month: Couroupita guianensis (Lecythidacea) "Cannon Ball tree". With distribution in northern South America, this large.



relatively growing tree is bound to be a talking point. Still relatively in cultivation, a rather struggling specimen found Esplanade, Cairns. With large leaves clustered rosettes branch tips, the tree is subject to several leaf drops a year. Flowering large sees striking 15cm) pinkish red fleshy

six petaled flowers with fat yellow off-centred stamens, .emerging from trunk and branches. Some controversy exists over whether the flower's perfume is sweet or disagreeable.

After flowering, seed pods in the shape of round very hard shelled "cannon balls" set at the end of long "strings" which add further to the striking appearance of the tree. These fruits taking up to a year to mature, contain several seeds enclosed in pulp of a very disagreeable odor. Definitely not a tree for small spaces or for the faint hearted but certainly a "must see before you die" tree. Possibly cold tender when young.

Native: Agapetes meiniana (Ericaceae) "Misty Bells" A super little treasure coming from the rainforests of North Queensland above 1200 metres and not frequently found in nurseries but certainly well worth while keeping an eye out for. A member of the heath family which is poorly represented in Australia, A.meiniana is a shrubby, semi-scandent plant with glossy, oval to lanceshaped leaves up to 70 mm long which have a pinkish tinge when new. The red or pink tubular bell shaped flowers to 30mm long have a waxen texture and occur in the leaf axils. Flowering may occur at any time of the year.

Of fairly easy cultivation, it is best grown in a semi shaded moist location protected from full sun and requiring acid soil, good drainage, high humidity with adequate water year round. With its attractive foliage Agapetes makes an excellent container plant or, with its trailing growth, a superb hanging basket specimen. It can also be grown successfully indoors. Propagation is relatively easy from cuttings, however with its very fine root structure extra care must be taken when planting out. Agapetes serpens, an Asian relative, also hailing from higher altitudes is another stunning acquisition so keep your eyes peeled for these treasures.

Q. & A. Dear Carlie, With your plans for a purely Australian native garden, you requested the names of some plants suitable for understorey planting. I would highly recommend Gardening with Rainforest Plants by Ralph Bailey and Julie Lake and published by Blooming Books as an excellent reference. To get you started, some easily available plants are Adiantum diaphanum (Filmy Maidenhair) Adiantum hispidulum (Rough Maidenhair), Bowenia serrulata (Byfield Fern) and Bowenia spectbilis (Zamia Fern), Curcuma australasica (Cape York Lily), Gardenia sp "Glennie River, Prophys Chamii (Brisbane Lily) and Viola hederacea (Native Violet).

Dear Robert, Yes what you saw at the Mareeba Markets was a species Hippeastrum, H. papilio with its unique color and pattern with broad rose-burgundy center stripes and striations on pale green on the upper petals and narrow stripes on the bottom three. This has been used to introduce striping into many of today's large flowering hybrids. Also frequently available at the Markets and one to keep your eye out for is the species H. reticulatum, characterized by its prominent whitish mid-vein and head of pale pink flowers. Both, like their larger flowered relatives, are amenable to pot culture or planted in semi shaded position with good drainage, watering well and feeding when in leaf growth. With nearly eighty species and some interesting semi-epiphytic types (H. calyptratum, H. aulicum, H.arboricola), the species Hippeastrum introduce a delicacy of flower and wide colour range into the tropical garden.

Dear Sandy, Yes, you are correct. Seed pods are of Grevillea and should turn brown to black as ripening to open to small flat seed easily sown. Remember that it is important to fertilize carefully using fertilizers low in Phosphorus as, like most natives species, grevilleas are intolerant to high concentrations.



HERBAL OILS: METHODS OF PREPARATION

- Mix one part herb with four parts oil and sixteen parts water, e.g. 2 ounces of herb to 4 cups of oil and 16 cups of water. Bring to a boil and simmer until all the water evaporates (approximately 4 to 8 hours); Strain to render the herbal oil.
- Make a strong tea of the desired herbs first, using 2 ounces of herb to 16 cups of water. Strain the decoction and add 4 cups of oil to the liquid. Simmer until all of the water is evaporated. (In both of the previous methods, one can prevent the oil from scorching by placing a few thin slices of fresh ginger into the oil and tea mixture as it simmers down.)
- Bruise fresh herbs, put them in a jar and cover them with oil. Put them in strong sunlight for 30 days. Strain and keep refrigerated. (Calendula oil is made this way, using marigold petals.)
- Cayenne, clove, or mustard powder can be simmered directly in oil on a very low flame for several hours.
- Fresh juice of heating herbs like garlic or ginger, or cooling herbs such as comfrey, cilantro, or fennel can be mixed with equal amounts of oil. The oil and juice will separate and spoil, so needs refrigeration. Shake well before using. These are not designed to be kept for long periods.
- Add essential oil to a base oil such as jojoba, calendula, almond, grape seed, or canola; 20 drops of
 essential oil to 2 fluid ounces of base oil. Always test on a small area of skin to check for allergenic
 reactions. If this occurs with an oil that you feel good about, dilute more until there is no allergic
 response.
- Add herbal powders directly to the oil or ghee. This creates a paste that is used more like a body scrub or a cream for points of tension or injury.

EGGLESS CORN BREAD

1 cup cornmeal 1/2 cup barley flour 1/2 cup oat flour

1/2 teaspoon sea salt

1 teaspoon baking powder

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups buttermilk, or $\frac{1}{2}$ cup low-fat yogurt and 1 cup water

1 tablespoon apple concentrate


Sift dry ingredients together. Then mix all ingredients in a bowl. Let stand covered for one hour. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Bake in a well-greased pan or 8 by 8 inch baking pan for 40 to 45 minutes. Serve immediately.

This moist, slightly sour dough flavoured bread is an easy one for those looking to avoid eggs. If you like, you can bring the cup of water to a boil and pour it over the cornmeal first before adding the rest of the ingredients. This calms the slight bitterness of the cornmeal and brings out a bit of sweetness.

The Frog Decline Reversal Project

whom you already know as the Cairns Frog Hospitalis going to be tossed out of its current rental property in September and our group has decided to use this timing to relocate the organisation to the Tablelands. We are looking for expressions of interest from acreage owners for a very long term lease arrangement. This might be to lease a "typical" house with a few acres around it from an owner, or to lease a segment of a larger holding, or to find someone who has the resources to purchase a property which can then be rented to us.

We would prefer that some sort of liveable structure is already present on the property and that it has mains power and a phone line. The liveable structure is to house our Curator and our office (computers, printers, photocopier, fax). A shed/room for some storage space would be good if this is not already covered within the liveable structure. Any water source is fine but we would be willing to add water tanks if they aren't already there. Composting toilet, septic or town sewerage is fine. Some space for a veggie garden, some fruit trees and chooks is desired by our Curator who wants the acreage experience to encourage a more self-sufficient lifestyle.

The rescue of sick and injured frogs is being downsized in our restructure plan in favour of more education, tadpole rescue and breeding. We would prefer the property to be at least partially rainforested or directly adjoining rainforest so that we can enhance in situ frog breeding by adding in a few small ponds. The presence of a permanent creek would be especially attractive. If the situation includes a 'typical' house but the land has been previously cleared, we would still be interested so long as the owner wants it replanted, the soil type supports rainforest species and there is some kind of corridor connection to

intact or secondary forest so that wildlife can return to the property.

We hope for our presence on a property to be mutually beneficial and, as a tax deductable organisation, we may be able to enhance the value of the property through the contribution of water tanks or sheds, for example. Other support such as hand weeding, revege, helping with animal care, etc. can be discussed.



New Member: The Arts Co-operative is pleased to introduce artist Gerhard (Naturesface) to the community. This year, Gerhard returned to Kuranda to live after having been away for over 15 years.

Growing up in the rainforest, diving and fishing gave him an appreciation

of the natural world and the unlimited creativity it releases. He has lived and studied Art/ Design in San Francisco, Berlin, and Melbourne. However, Gerhard says cities don't interest him right now as he finds himself retracing steps he took many years ago along the Barron River and through the bush. Wait-a-while, leeches and mould bring back memories for Gerhard of how it was, and still is, in this environment.

"Organic Photo Montage" is the style Gerhard uses when creating images and he has labeled his product 'Naturesface'. His process starts by collecting natural textures which are then photographed, scanned and sometimes drawn. The computer is used as a mixing pot allowing things to be combined in a seamless way. Gerhard's imagery is strongly influenced by the Buddhist/ Taoist philosophy: nature and humanity are one. The human body contains a miniature universe, a macrocosm. 'Naturesface' reflects this universe embedded in the human body. He has attempted to acknowledge the extraordinary in the ordinary and the art of seeing is what motivates him.

"Head in the clouds and feet on the ground I believe nature is art, and art is my nature," says Gerhard. "I also believe we are spiritual beings having a human experience".

Rak Razaam (writer/co-founder of Undergrowth magazine) says of Gerhard Hillman's images "His lush, organic textures show us a world where nature speaks, where beauty and geometry can be found in the crease of a butterfly's wings, the shape of a shell or the bloom of the vegetal world. In artwork collections such as "Texture in Time", Hillman juxtaposes organic textures with subtle and psychedelic layering, showing the true secret of nature, the sacred consciousness that creates, sustains and amazes.



LIBRARY NEWS

It continues to be a busy time at the Kuranda Library and with the upgrade looming ever closer it's set to become even more hectic. On top of that, the tourist season is well into the swing of it, and the internet is proving very popular. If you wish to use the public internet computers in the library we recommend you book by calling on 07 4093 9185 or popping in. Internet is charged at \$3.00/hr for members and \$3.50/half hr for visitors. You can use the computers for some purposes for free - just check with the Library staff.

If you are lucky enough to own a computer then you can access the OPAC from the comfort of your own home. If you visit http://www.library.msc.qld.gov.au/ you can search for material held at the four Mareeba Shire Libraries - Kuranda, Mareeba, Chillagoe and Dimbulah and can easily place reservations to pick up from your local Kuranda Branch. If you don't have a computer you can browse the catalogue from the Kuranda Library OPAC.

One of the most exciting changes with the new system will in fact happen on the OPAC. Many of the features will be updated and you will now have access to several Reading Lists. These will include; New Titles, Top 10, Prize Winners and Authors by Genre. While this feature should be available almost immediately, it may take a little time to work some of the kinks out. For now, a title listed on one of these pages doesn't necessarily mean we hold it in the library.

For borrowers who have children and with school holidays coming up, it's important for parents to remember that they can't leave their children in the Library unsupervised. It is for the safety of the children and the Library resources (and in rare cases, the sanity of the staff members!) and, while we love having children in the library, we do ask that they are accompanied by a responsible adult.

We also have a few very special Children's activities coming up. Our regular Storytime will be on the 7th of September and all the kids will have to leave their pirate gear at home and be prepared for some MAGIC! The day before our regular Storytime is a Nation Wide Simultaneous Storytime on the 6th of September. We will be reading Mem Fox's *The Magic Hat* at the same time as other libraries all over Australia.

For those who have a slightly more mature taste, we have some fantastic new Adult Fiction in stock at the Mareeba Shire Library Service. Michael Robotham, James Patterson, Jackie Collins, Clive Cussler, Rachael Treasure and Paulo Coelho all have new titles in the Library. If none of these authors interest you then pop into the Library and discuss your reading tastes with us... we have several tools available to help.

With the new system probably in place by the time you read this, it is a time of exploration at the Mareeba Shire Library Service. Come in and discover more about what we do, the books we hold and the things that interest you. We hope everyone enjoys the Spring Fair and the amazing variety of entertainment and life coming to the Kuranda region as summer creeps in again. And when you need to relax, or escape from the daily rush, come into the library – we'll see you there.

'CARING FOR KURANDA'

The Flu - What To Do? How can I prevent getting it? *The best way statistically is by flu



Flu season is upon us, and this year is shaping up to be the worst we've had for a few years. What can you do to help prevent getting it or suffering the worst effects?

What is the Flu? *

First, it is not the same as the common cold. It is caused by a different virus. In general, the flu is worse than the common cold, and symptoms such as fever, body aches, extreme tiredness, and dry cough are more common and intense, with more likelihood of it

developing serious complications such as pneumonia. In children, in particular, there can be gastrointestinal symptoms - such as nausea, diarrhoea and vomiting.

How do I know if it is the Flu?

*Usually by symptoms and severity - but a lab test can be done in the first 2-3 days to

How soon will I get sick if exposed to Flu?

*About 1-4 days

How long is a person contagious?

*This depends on the age and health of the person. In healthy adults the contagious period is usually from 1 day prior to getting sick to 5 days after. Young people and people with weak immune systems may be longer.

How does it spread?

*By droplet. So that means coughing and sneezing and also on hands if they cough on them or touch their mouths.

*The best way statistically is by flu vaccination , though by now it is starting to get a bit late as it takes a couple of weeks to build up immunity. Vaccinations are still available though for anyone over 6mths. The best time to get vaccinated is early in the year after the latest vaccine is released around March. If you had the flu or flu shot last year it will give you some level of immunity to other flu viruses of the same or closely related strains. There are many different strains though and each year the vaccine covers 3 or 4 of the most prevalent for that season. Also keeping your immune system healthy by sleeping and eating well, drink plenty of fluids, avoid drugs, smoking and alcohol and of course stress which can be a big immune system depressant. *Other measures to prevent spread * - wash your hands regularly (especially if you are handling money etc). Cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze. Avoid physical contact with others. Avoid social gatherings and going to work while you are contagious - STAY AT HOME!

Treatment

Rest - Plenty of fluids - Medications to relieve symptoms. Many have heard of the new antviral medications such as Tamiflu. This is not a first choice treatment. Overuse can create resistance in the viruses and they may not be then able to help if we get a really bad

Most people will recover in a week, with some lingering on for 2 weeks. If you aren't getting better in this time frame or start getting worse again, go and see your doctor as you could be developing a more serious bacterial infection such as pneumonia.

I realise many need sick certificates for work when you have the flu - but if you don't or your employer is understanding (employers?) - don't go to the doctors as you may be infecting people who already have other health issues and it is the last thing they need!

Let's hope you get through another year without the flu!








When you find a bird the best way to catch a frightened bird is to throw a towel or a rug over it and pick it up, making sure that you hold the wings close to its body. If the bird has a broken leg or wing

Put it in a box, in a quiet, warm place. Do not offer any food or water and contact us ASAP. If the bird has been caught by a cat or dog Cats have harmful bacteria in their mouth and on their claws, if the bird has been well and truly caught it is unlikely it will survive, even if it appears to have plenty of energy. The best thing to do is to put it in a box, in a quiet, warm place, and contact us ASAP. Early administration of antibiotics is very important. If you find the bird late in the evening, place in an appropriate size box, cover and keep warm until the morning, then if it is still alive get on the phone. Do not offer food or water. If the bird has hit a window and is stunned. Put the bird in a warm, quiet, dark place for several hours and reassess it. Ouite often the bird will recover and fly away. If not, contact us. If the bird is an orphan. Are you sure it really is an orphan? Baby birds are not often far away from their nests. Some birds, such as kookaburras, leave the nest and then spend a few days on the ground, being cared for by the parents, before they can fly competently. Of course, if a cat or dog is watching the baby bird, remove the dog or cat rather than the bird. If you find a baby bird, try to find the nest and return it to the nest. Ducklings: Have specific diets, and need specialised care ASAP. Other

Life is an art, you are the artist! Come Enjoy!



The need for rationalisation and modernisation of the structure of local government was recognised by the local government sector itself with the establishment of the Size Shape and Sustainability process. However, after two years

the Size Shape and Sustainability process. However, after two years of work, local government failed to agree on substantive reform and the voluntary adoption of new boundaries that reflect modern conditions and circumstances remained a forlorn hope.

Thecomposition of the commission reflected a diversity of political and occupational backgrounds. The timetable for reform was dictated by the need to have the necessary changes so that local government elections could proceed as scheduled in March 2008. The government accepted 22 of the commissions 25 recommendations. One of the recommendations that the government did not accept was that all new local government areas should be undivided. As a result, both the Cairns Regional Council and the Tableland Regional Council will have divisional representation. This is a good outcome for locals and one that I support.

I have to say that most people that I have spoken to do support the government's reforms. Others have expressed concern about the process adopted by the government, particularly the provisions in the legislation that made unlawful the conduct of plebiscites. I am pleased the government has acknowledged those concerns and has introduced legislation

to make those provisions of no effect. However, the new local government structure is now law and it seems futile to waste taxpayers or ratepayers money on conducting a poll that can have no practical effect.

In the electorate of Barron River, Kuranda is the only area directly affected by the reforms and then only to a limited extent. The Mareeba Shire will be amalgamated with Atherton Herberton and Eacham Shire to form the Tablelands Regional Council. The Mareeba Shire was formerly an undivided council, so Kuranda residents will gain divisional representation.

In the meantime, I will continue to work hard on a range of measures that I believe will improve the States' ability to protect our environment, support and diversify our economy and enhance the enviable lifestyle we all enjoy. Some of these measures include:

Developing the FNQ 2025 regional plan.

Strengthening protection for biodiversity.

Improving public transport.

Reviewing the Integrated Planning Act and other state law and policies with the objective of having all old development approvals assessed against current planning laws.

Expanding the range of recreational opportunities afforded by our unique natural land and sea scapes.







*MAXIMISING YOUR DEDUCTIONS

This month I have included a few work-related deductions that may increase your tax refund.

TELEPHONE EXPENSES

You can claim a deduction for the cost of work related phone calls from your mobile or home phone. You can also claim a deduction for your telephone rental if you can show you were on call or were regularly required to phone your employer or clients while you were away from your workplace. The cost must be apportioned between work related and private use.

BOOKS, JOURNALS AND PROFESSIONAL LIBRARIES

You can claim a deduction for the cost of trade magazines, technical and reference journals if they are required to do your work. You can also claim a deduction for the decline in value of a professional library that includes books, tapes, compact disc, DVDs and videos. If you are studying and not able to claim these items at present you may be able to claim them as part of a work-related professional library when you do begin work. Please, please, please keep your receipts or this opportunity will pass you by.

SEMINARS, CONFERENCES OR EDUCATION WORKSHOPS

The cost of attending seminars, conferences or education workshops that are connected to your work activities are claimable.

*CHANGE OF ASSOCIATION RULES

On the 15th March 2007, the Queensland Parliament approved changes to the Associations Incorporation Act to make life easier for associations. The changes were effective Friday 15th June 2007. There are new financial reporting requirements. If the association has a total revenue of less than \$20,000 and current assets of less than \$20,000 an audit may not be required. 

Land for Wildlife

Land for Wildlife is a voluntary program which aims to encourage and assist private landholders to provide habitat for wildlife on their properties. Land for Wildlife listing will not change the legal status of the property in any way.

Private landholders hold the key to the survival of many species of wildlife. National parks and related reserves cover only 4% of Queensland. Over 90% of bushland in the state home to many rare animals and plants – is managed primarily for purposes other than wildlife conservation. Habitat on private land contributes to the survival of rare species particularly those which are dependent on particular habitats. The protection of remnant vegetation is especially important. Habitat on private land can also provide links between isolated nature reserves.

For Kuranda, situated on the narrow junction of the north and south World Heritage Wet Tropics areas, providing corridors for wildlife to move around the village, highway, railway and gorge presents unique challenges. The Envirolink Wildlife Corridor to the west of Kuranda offers one such linkage. The Land for Wildlife properties adjoining the Corridor, State Forest, Wet Tropics and throughout the general area are a vital addition to habitat and extend linkages further for moving animals. Cassowaries are regularly seen attempting to cross the highway at Top of the Range. Thanks to the bright yellow "Be aware" signs local drivers know to watch out for them.

As the green Land for Wildlife signs continue to spread throughout the Kuranda area is possible that not all of you are receiving your quarterly newsletter. There are a couple of reasons for this. If a sign remained when a property was purchased then the registration has not carried over to the new owners. Secondly during a computer changeover at headquarters a number of records vanished. If you are not receiving the newsletter simply call Margaret on $4093\ 8393$

Cassowaries on the move

There have been a number of reports of a mature cassowary on the Range road and sightings of an immature bird as well near where the Be aware signs have been placed. One of our members was lucky enough to photograph a mature bird. What a thrill to see one roaming wild! Please be extra cautious along this stretch of road from the Barron River bridge to Rainforestation. I'm sure no one wants to be the first to create cassowary road

kill in our area.

Seeds are beginning to drop again, from some trees a few drop per day causing the birds to travel to inspect those trees frequently. There have been a number of sightings around Butler Drive and Black Mountain road too as young birds are being pushed away in preparation for the mating seasons. This is a vulnerable time for the young so if you have dogs, please obey the by-laws and make sure they are secure within your property, not out roaming the streets during the day or night.

Plant of the month Silver Leaved Paperbark

In flower at the moment is the attractive Silver Leaved Paperbark (Melaleuca argentea) which can be seen on the Kennedy Highway near Speewah. The trees are generally smaller and more spreading than the Weeping Paperbark, with creamy white to grey bark. The flowers are cream to green, rather similar to the flower spikes on the Broad Leaved Paperbark, but usually smaller (about 50-60mm long). Trees bear a large number of flowers, which would make them a desirable addition to a large garden.

What really makes Melaleuca argentea trees stand out, though, is the new growth, which is silver in colour, caused by fine hairs on the leaves and stems. As the leaves mature they tend to lose the hairs and the resulting silver colour. The leaves are widest in the middle, tapering evenly to each end, and have several

Edominant veins with a network of finer veins between. Aboriginal people in the Northern Territory used the leaves to flavour meat in cooking. The trees commonly grow close to creeks or gullies, and may reach a large size on riverbanks. The fruits are typical of paperbarks, small cup-shaped woody capsules clustered on the stems






