## **126 Years of Kuranda Postal Services**

HIS MONTH will mark the 126th anniversary of the first official Kuranda Post Office, which opened on 25th June 1891 at the Kuranda railway station. The 1888 telegraphic receiving office at Middle Crossing, where the first settlement was on the Barron where the road bridge is now, was discontinued. At this time Queensland was still a self-governing Colony and operated its own postal service. The postal service did not become a Commonwealth service until Federation in 1901, when all communications came under the

nn 1901, when all communications can Postmaster-General.

Kuranda, because of its gateway position to all the bounty of Tablelands and North, and through the incredible engineering feat of the Cairns to Kuranda railway, pretty much kept pace with communication developments across the State.

The first ballast trains rolled into Kuranda in May 1891 and on June 15th 1891 the line opened for goods traffic only. Just ten days later, the Cairns-Kuranda railway line was opened to passenger travel and in no small coincidence, so did the Kuranda Post Office.

Although Kuranda in 1891 was it seems well served by post, residents beyond were anxious that the roll out of rail to Granite Creek [Mareeba] and Herberton continue apace and in December 1891 a mysterious correspondent to The Cairns Post, writing under the

title of "Echoes" wrote "Foster, the village blacksmith, orator and rattling good fellow is now located at Myola. Myola wants a post office badly. Koah has no post office and it wants one. Kowrowa has no post office, and languishes in consequence. A postal service is badly wanted between Kuranda and Biboohra. Welcome Pocket has a school and energetic residents, yet has no post office. "

In 1892 the Cairns Post asserted "that the press has a direct interest in seeing people are properly supplied fairly with mail services goes without saying. More particularly this Happy New Year when newspapers must be stamped before passing through the post. The least that can be said of the new departure is that it is retrograde one but at all events the unhappy newspaper man can now say "The people pay postage on papers, they have the right to receive them". The reference to stamped newspapers refers to a Qld tax on newspapers sent through mail. If you check the masthead of this paper you will see still we have the compulsory printed "Postage Paid, Kuranda".

In 1903 when the Queensland Premier Sir S W Griffiths toured the North, he received many complaints about the lack of a mail service beyond Kuranda. "Great irritation exists amongst the residents of the town-ship on the third section of the Herbert railway between Kuranda and Biboohra (a distance of over 20 miles) that there is no mail service.

The Premier's response was not well received. "The people were informed a mail bag was sent to Messers McKenzie and Co, the contractors for the third section and that the bag in question would or must answer all purposes. But could anything be more ridiculous than to imagine that the contractors of the railway have nothing else to do than perform Post Office work for the sheer love of the thing?"

Reports of the delights of the train to Kuranda, and beauty of both the journey and town, abounded in newspapers and magazines. A writer "Notanauta" in a piece for the Bendigo Advertiser in 1904 wrote tongue in cheek "Steam Vanquishes Electricity On A Steep Grade" saying "We reached the town at half-past 11 o'clock, an hour and a half in advance of our telegrams engaging rooms, which were therefore nearly four hours on their journey from Cairns railway station to Kuranda, where the hotel is

within 100 yards of the nation – but then the journey is uphill, which no doubt places electricity at a disadvantage."

While the Postmaster-General seemed to think all was well at Kuranda in 1906 "the supply of postage stamps at the Kuranda Post Office was found to amply meet local requirements", not everyone felt the postal service adequate for such an important resort town.

The Kuranda Railway station at the time of the first post office was not the

world famous one we all know today, the buildings were recycled ones from the closing Kamerunga station. In a 1909 letter to The Cairns Post in a piece entitled "The Tin Pot Railway" it was said that "the whole of the services therein [at Kuranda] railway, telegraph, telephone, money order posts office etc are all run by one man who also has to do the bell ringing and act as a shunter. Is this the evidence of progressiveness for tourists and visitors?"

And in 1910 a writer to The Cairns Post called just "Kuranda" wrote "there is no covered platform at the railway station. No butcher or baker so bread and meat has to be brought in from Mareeba and is put out with other parcels and is a temptation to "dogs and goats, plenty of which are always about".

Still, the hard put upon railway/postmaster in Kuranda appears to have had it better than those working in the

Cairns post office "a den of iniquity. In which Federal employees are sweated in two ways *[heat and overwork]* more than in any instance ever before beheld by the writer. Working from 8am to 2 or 3 the following morning. The writer saw 171 bags and baskets of mail thrown off one steamer, and

before the crew had got a fair start on them in came 57 by train, the contents of every one of them which had to be sorted in that inferno. "In 1913 Kuranda did indeed get a new railway station "a commodious building of neat design with one end for the lessee's refreshment room and the other end the station master's office and telegraph.

#### **Concerned Resident Calls for Action**

I've lived in Kuranda for around 20 years, the last seven in the centre of town, which makes me an authority on what goes on in the centre of town. I've seen and heard it all and it's getting worse. This letter is an excerpt from my recent Facebook post on the "All Things Kuranda" page.

There is a bunch of indigenous people in this town, some local, some blow-ins, that believe this town is 'their town'. They show no respect for either themselves, their families, their 'country' or anybody else.

They roam the streets during the days, harassing tourists and anybody else they think they can 'get' something out of—smokes, money etc., whilst night after night they drink themselves into an oblivious stupor. They get so drunk they begin to argue abusively. Then they start fighting and smashing bottles—like clockwork, almost every night.

Most of us living in the centre of Kuranda fear for our safety after dark and many of us do not venture out due to the rise of alcohol-fuelled, racist, antisocial behaviour being a constant threat to us. The poor street and park lighting makes it easy for this scum to hide just about everywhere and literally jump out on unsuspecting victims anytime, whilst the fact that Kuranda Police can no longer be relied upon to come to anybody's assistance within an acceptable time frame, does not help either. They know this. Up to two hours if you get a response. It has become the norm now to be woken up in the dead of night by these hooligans.

How do we break this cycle?

#### **Important Advice: NBN Fixed Wireless**

An important and timely edition which I could not fit into my "TechTalk with Thomas" column for this month's Paper.

As many of you know I operate Cairns Computer Support based in Speewah. This past week I have spent several hours with two senior NBNCo employed Fixed Wireless engineers and senior NBNCo employed field technicians inspecting properties where clients had previously been told their wireless test failed. This was as a result of several complaints of residents that had failed to get an NBN signal when visited by an NBNCo contractor to install their NBN Fixed Wireless service. 100% of my clients visited resulted in a pass despite prior fails. There are a handful of 'technicians' that appear to be either too lazy to search for a suitable signal, perhaps considered some jobs 'too hard' – especially when it involved installing a mast, are inadequately trained, or in one call actually not even NBNCo accredited although working for an NBNCo accredited contractor - meaning that they will not have completed the required NBNCo training or accreditation courses, therefore likely don't know how to effectively use the equipment to detect a signal - often resulting in fails or bad installs.

All NBN contractors and installers MUST present identification to you in the form or an NBNCo accredited ID card stating their name, photo, and sporting the NBNCo logo. If you have a technician unable to present this info, you should not permit them to work on your site, and immediately report it to NBNCo on 1800 881 816 (make sure you also get the technician's name and company). Whilst they may indeed be legitimately there to install your service, they may likely just be working for someone else contracted by NBNCo, but not themselves accredited by NBNCo to do so, in this case you should NOT not sign their work orders either! Also if you feel that your technician DID NOT make a genuine effort to detect a signal or you feel they could have done better – you are not obliged to sign off the work order they present.

It's good to see that NBN are now cracking down on technicians and getting more people online and services rectified. Hopefully this means less rogue technicians, less dodgy installs and more signal passes! If you wish to get in touch for a chat – call me anytime to discuss.

Kuranda's fame spread internationally and in 1936 it was reported "tourist traffic brings to all places in its wake various sources of revenue". At the Post Office at Kuranda in July "there were 936 outward calls, 1890 inward calls and 232 telegrams were transmitted".

Another 40 years of lobbying for a Kuranda Post Office in the centre of town passed. "Could the PMG Department be approached with regard to the erection of a combined suitable post office and Commonwealth Bank somewhere in centre of town. The present one is inadequate and has little privacy. It would also save people the long and tedious walk to the station for telephone".

While the call for improvements became ever more pressing, results were slow "Member for Kennedy Mr W. J. F. Riorden advised that the railway authorities had agreed to place a suitable writing table in the public vestibule adjacent to, and between, the railway ticket office and post office window. It is also proposed to install a full length Public telephone cabinet in a corner of the passage between the 'up' and 'down' platforms". The Cairns Post 1946.

However, in 1950 following "strong personal representations" by the Federal Member for Leichhardt Mr. T. V. Gilmore [our present Mayor's father] the Postmaster-General Mr. H. L. Anthony advised that it was the intention of the department to remove the Post Office at Kuranda to a more suitable location and, at the same time, to convert the existing manual telephone exchange to the automatic system. The Post Office will be conducted under non-official conditions and the necessary action to obtain suitable accommodation and the services of a person to conduct the office is now taking place. It is also proposed to provide an additional trunk line from Kuranda to Cairns and this work is expected to be completed during the next few months. Mr. Gilmore went on to say that it had been arranged also, that when automatic facilities are installed, a public telephone will be provided at the new Post Office, and this will be in addition to the one already at the railway station,

which will remain in service at that location". Several official visits to examine the sites were conducted (usually with an overnight stay in a lovely Kuranda hotel) and although other towns supposedly got their promised modern design in "brick and concrete", Kuranda resident Charlie King built a timber post office/café on the corner of Coondoo and Thongon Streets, with the post office residence being supplied by the existing house adjacent which had belonged to Frederick Parkhurst Dodd, the world famous 'Butterfly Man of Kuranda'.

On Thursday September 6th 1951, the new automatic telephone exchange at Kuranda opened with a capacity of 40 subscribers. Twenty eight subscribers were connected to it at the date of opening. It operated "entirely unattended" with continuous service throughout the day and night. Concurrently, the new Kuranda Post Office opened on Coondoo Street where it stayed until Steve Dominikovic bought it in the late 1980s, and in order to redevelop the site, sold the post office building to Dug Stratford who moved it out to his property on the Kennedy Highway, where it remains to this day.

Earlier this year, the post office was on the move again to the old library site on Thoree Street, in the building which was previously the Grogan family home.

The Kuranda Paper extends best wishes to Colin and Cindy and staff at the Kuranda Post Office. Happy 126th anniversary.



## **Kuranda Post Office: Memories of Sloth and Slippers**

When I arrived in Kuranda in 1971 I had little reason to visit the Kuranda Post Office. As a teenage runaway my chances of receiving mail were zero until I had enough courage to tell my long suffering parents that I had followed the sun north to what had been described to me as "the prettiest little town in Australia".

However, it turned out that hanging out at the Post Office was THE place to be on any fine morning (the cool, dark, covered footpath with long wooden benches outside the Fitzpatrick Hotel opposite was the rainy day alternative). The vacant block next to the Post Office had a slight rise just perfect for lying back and cloud watching. On 'cheque' days the grass was covered in 'hippies' and some locals too, chatting, chilling and on occasion making a little music. And after a while, watching

the cloud watchers, were passersby. On foot, in cars, and over time on tour buses, slowly passing by to catch the Kuranda 'show'.

The funky old wooden Post Office itself was far removed from the brick and glass suburban one of my childhood. There was not much room in front of the wide timber counter where Mr Sloth dispensed mail and Mrs Slippers chased up parcels. Those of course are not their real names. If I ever knew their names I have forgotten. I have recently been given the hint of Mr and Mrs Wilkinson. But in my mind they remain fondly Mr Sloth (he had the look of a kindly turtle who had left his shell hanging on the back door) and Mrs Slippers (who wore fluffy ones, especially in winter).

This elderly couple dealt so calmly with the influx of odd looking young strangers with sometimes even odder names, who often arrived at the counter after

a morning in the mushroom fields. Time moved very slowly at such times, and just as well because it could take a while to be able to collect your mail. This was due in large part to Mr Sloth's habit of dispensing general mail alphabetically. To his left along the wall were a series of wooden pigeon holes labelled A-Z. He would start at A and nothing, at least during the morning call, could induce him to skip a letter or go back to G once he had started H. It was on through 26 letters and then back around again. And again.

Fortunately, along the side of the building closest the vacant lot, were a few open windows and so it was possibly to keep track of his progress while enjoying the sun and company. If your name was Jones you had best get up at G and get close to the counter, or possibly wait on the step outside ready to cry out 'Here' loud enough to capture his attention and avoid another round.

I don't know if they had always had the A-Z strategy before 'the hippies' or if it was a plan to deal with all the increased work. If rather dedicated to this routine they were still incredibly polite and helpful. But it was best to come back in the afternoon if you had any real business to do. After 2.00pm that is because much of North Queensland, and almost all of Kuranda, closed for lunch 1.00pm to 2.00pm back then. In Kuranda only the Shell Shop service station, now the BP, stayed open (and, unofficially, the bar at Fitzy's).

There being no internet back then (just a few public phones in Kuranda and so few private ones that people only had to give you the last three digits of their number) letters, postcards, telegrams and aerograms were the way people communicated.

With time on our hands, and 'enhanced' creativity to spare, letters in highly decorated envelopes were sent and in turn received, often addressed to just one name and that often not an 'official' name, and 'Kuranda, Queensland'. They were happily dispatched by S&S and as I found out also happily received. One afternoon when I went in to get stamps and check my mail, Mrs Slippers said "I just want to tell you dear how much pleasure all these letters give us. They are just like little works of art. So much better than plain old letters."

I have just one envelope which has survived from around that time — it is from 1975. I think Sloth and Slippers had left by then. I don't know exactly when they left or what happened to them but I still smile when I think of them. If any of their family should read this I just want to say they were part of the

reason I still live here: the kindness of strangers to strangers and even more so the kindness of strangers to the children of strangers. Thanks S&S.

In 1987 my doodles again made a Kuranda postal connection when my Licuala palm design, commonly called the Kuranda fan palm back in those days, and artist Bruce Zielinski's iconic frog were incorporated

into the Kuranda (then 4872) Postmark following an Australia Post competition where we were joint winners. I feel really honored to be just a tiny part of what will be 126 years of postal history in Kuranda on 25th June. Thanks to all the Post Office staff of the past and best wishes to Colin, Cindy and staff in our "newest" Post Office.

# Gardening in Kuranda with Alectura

**UNE** and with the days drawing in, this month the Winter solstice with its least amount of daylight hours, will come and go. Meantimes, both ambient and soil temperatures continue to fall and Winter's sleep slows the garden's growth.

Again enjoying the visits of the honeyeaters to the explosion of red, orange and yellow in the metre high long-lasting floral display of *Aechmea blanchetiana*. Both the red and yellow leafed forms of this large

growing, sun loving, tough bromeliad provide sculptural form in pot or garden.

Now is a good time to source *Aristolochia tagala*, host plant of the large electric

green Cairns Birdwing butterfly. This native vine is best planted near or over a tree or large shrub where the caterpillars can shelter when moulting and making their chrysalises. Given the caterpillars' voracious appetites, it is probably best to plant several vines around the garden. Plants are obtainable at local markets, plant sales at the Flecker Botanical gardens and local nurseries. Easily germinated seed if often offered on eBay.

**PLANT OF THE MONTH:** *Licuala mattanensis*, the Mapu palm from Borneo is still a rather expensive, slow and sometimes difficult and challenging-to-grow small palm to 1m with exquisite mottled foliage and is somewhat of a collector's item with established specimens seldom available.





Possibly best pot grown, it must have consistently rich, moist but well drained soil, high humidity and a minimum temperature of 20°C for good growth. It is reputedly fairly sun hardy when established.

Propagated mainly from seed which is of short viability and somewhat slow to germinate and grow in the first few years, there is an extremely wide variation in the degree of tessellation and colouring. Flowering may commence from around six years and a specific pollinator may be involved in fruit set.

An easier grown substitute is *Licuala* radula, another mottled species that grows somewhat larger, sometime clumping with leaves generally not so strikingly mottled and with fewer, larger segments.

Equatorial Exotics with its extensive online catalogue carries Mapu seedlings which should be inspected for potential colouring.



**Q&A** *Dear Paul*, There is no doubt that many climbing plants produce prodigious floral displays. However, this is offset in that many in their seed set provide a great threat to our native forests. Rather than making planting recommendations as asked, I would encourage you to walk your neighbourhood or join your local garden group to learn more about what does well in your area and/or poses threat in too rampant growth and seed dispersal. I would also recommend that you carefully consider what kind of support your climber(s) of choice will need and allowing to clamber up trees is not a good long term option.

#### Lack of Spray Drift Buffer Zones in the New MSC2016 Plan

Considering the serious dangers of many of the chemicals used

in modern agriculture it follows that keeping this type of agriculture as far away as possible from populated areas and sensitive environmental areas is a safe precaution. The superseded MSC2004 plan asked for a 300 metre buffer zone between agriculture and non agricultural areas to protect from dangerous spray drift. However, the new MSC2016 plan has no such buffer provision in place.

To accommodate population growth in Koah the new MSC2016 plan rezoned land from rural to rural residential. It seems Council, however, has failed to take into consideration that some of the land was still under production using chemical farming methods in the middle of what is now rural residential zoned land.

When Council was asked to also include that protective provision in the new plan, the answer was "No". It was too restrictive and it is not Council's responsibility anyway. Under State regulation, chemical spray is not permitted to cross a boundary. In this conflict of interests where does that leave the Koah population and agriculture

previously roosted in were cut down in Basalt Gully. Council has mutilated one of the few areas in Mareeba town that had environmental protection under the MSC2016 plan and State regulations. As a result of this MSC is now being investigated by the Queensland Government Department of Natural Resources and Mines.

To make it even worse, the whole exercise seems pointless as the bats have returned close to where it all started anyway. But many magnificent old native trees which other wildlife and local residents used to enjoy are now gone forever. Is Council going to cut down more trees in Mareeba in order to drive the bats out of town? It seems like a case of cutting off the nose to spite the face.

Ring MSC and tell them to immediately stop clearing any more

native trees in Basalt Gully Reserve.

There is now a permanent Kup Muri pit in the very top



Some tourists may come via Skyrail / QRail but luggage and airport/reef transfers by Range Road. The road will not be upgraded by this Kur-World proposal. The range road is under huge pressure. 

With cooler weather comes the best time for an abundance of cheap available local greens. And all are easily grown in the home garden. A slow cooked bowl of delicious vegetable soup or risotto hits the easy meal mark. Three recipes here feature kale, rocket and rainbow chard. Team with crusty bread and a side salad for extra goodness. TIP: Double quantities for soups and enjoy over a few days.

#### BORLOTTI BEAN and KALE SOUP via taste.com.au

180g (1 cup) dried borlotti beans (which will make approx 2 cups once soaked and cooked or use cooked fresh or already cooked canned beans), 1 tablespoon olive oil, 1 large brown onion, finely chopped, 2 carrots, peeled (finely chopped), 2 celery sticks (finely chopped), 2 garlic cloves (crushed), 2 teaspoons fresh thyme leaves, 1/4 teaspoon dried chilli flakes, 1 tablespoon no-added-salt tomato paste, 400g can no-added-salt diced tomatoes, 1.25L (5 cups) water (approx.), 1 bunch kale leaves shredded or finely sliced (NO WASTE TIP: stalks can be chopped and frozen for your next soup, curry or stew). SERVES 4.

Method: If using dried beans soak them overnight and cook until tender. If using fresh borlottis (sometimes available this time of year in Mareeba or at Rustys Market) pod and cook in plain water until tender. If using dried or fresh discard the water they are cooked in as the complex sugars in the skins can cause gas. If using canned go straight to Step 2.

2. Heat the oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the onion, carrot and celery. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 6-7 minutes or until soft. Add the garlic, thyme and chilli flakes and stir for 1 minute or until aromatic. Add tomato paste. Stir for 1 minute or until combined. Add the beans, tomato and water to the saucepan. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer, partially covered, until all flavours are deliciously combined, adding a little more water if the soup becomes too thick. Add kale. Cook for 5 minutes or until wilted. Season with pepper.

#### POTATO, GARLIC AND ROCKET SOUP via lifestyle.com.au

1 head of garlic, 50g butter or substitute, 2 tblsp light olive oil, 1 onion, finely chopped, 1 leek, carefully washed and finely sliced, 1 large potato, finely diced, 750ml of stock, juice of a lemon (save a little zest for garnish), 75g rocket leaves, roughly chopped, 3 tbsp extra virgin olive oil, good quality, sea salt and freshly ground black pepper. SERVES 4.

**Method:** Preheat the oven to 180c. Using a sharp knife take the very top off the garlic bulb (this will make it easier to get the roasted cloves out). Place the garlic in the oven and cook for 45 minutes, when the cloves should then be lovely and soft. Remove the garlic bulb and allow to cool enough to handle. Then squeeze out the soft cloves. Melt the butter/substitute with the olive oil in a large pan. Add the onion and leek

and cook for two to three minutes until just beginning to soften. Add the potato and stir thoroughly to ensure the potatoes are well coated in the butter/substitute. Cover the pan and cook for a further 4-5 minutes stirring occasionally. Pour in the stock, bring the soup to the boil then reduce the heat. Cover the soup and simmer for 10-12

Season the soup with plenty of salt and pepper and stir in the lemon juice and roasted garlic. Blend in batches using a liquidiser or hand-held blender adding handfuls of rocket with each batch. Leave a few leaves to garnish. When ready to serve, finish with a drizzle of olive oil, black pepper, a few rocket leaves and a little lemon zest.

#### BARLEY "RISOTTO" with RAINBOW CHARD via sbs.com.au

2 tbsp vegetable oil, half medium white onion, chopped, 2 poblano or ancho chillies, seeds removed, finely chopped, 150g pearl barley, 500 mls approx vegetable stock, 1 tsp ground cumin, 1 corn cob, cooked in boiling water for 20 minutes, covered, 4 rainbow chard (silverbeet) leaves, rolled and chopped, stems cut into 3 cm (11/4 in) pieces, 3 spring onions (scallions), finely sliced, 1 small bunch coriander, chopped, 1/2 lemon, juiced, salt and freshly ground black pepper. SERVES 4.

**Method:** In a medium, lidded saucepan over medium heat, heat the oil and gently fry the onion and chillies for 5 minutes, covered with a lid, until softened. Stir in the barley and cumin and continue to fry for a minute. Add 500 ml (2 cups/18 fl oz) of stock to the pan. Bring to a gentle simmer, then cover with the lid and cook for 50-55 minutes, stirring from time to time, until the barley swells and is firm with a good bite. Check the texture, taste and season with salt and pepper. Cook for a few minutes more, if necessary. Set aside in the pan.

To finish the barley risotto, using a long knife, carefully cut the kernels off the corn cob by running a knife along the central core. Keep 4 of the biggest lengths intact to use as garnish. Set these aside then release the kernels from the rest. Add the chard stems and leaves, spring onion and loose corn kernels to the barley pan and stir. Place the pan back on medium heat and cook for 12 minutes. Add the coriander (save a little for garnish) and cook for a further minute until wilted. Finally, taste and adjust the seasoning if required, then add the lemon juice to sharpen the flavour. To serve, plate up and garnish with reserved corn lengths and a little coriander if

## **Ngoonbi's New Drop-In Centre**

Ngoonbi Youth at Risk has opened a drop-in centre for youth aged 12 to 25. The drop-in centre opens after school and some nights, and hours will be extended in the future. There are six laptop computers which were donated by Australia Post for use, including practising their drivers learners test before trying the real one at Main roads.

We have a pool room with pool table, electric drums, guitars and a Karaoke machine which is used daily with the singing getting quite loud and enthusiastic. In the mornings young people can access the kitchen to make lunch for school and then get a lift if they have missed the bus. In the afternoon there is a rush to be



movie room. We have had lots of playstation 2 games donated but do not have a console. If anyone has one they no longer want we would be very grateful if they would like to donate it.

At the moment we are trying to get 6 people interested in completing a **Certificate** in Retail and the Organisation will run the course here in Kuranda. We also have **Anger Control Training** on weekly, which runs for six sessions. Billy Ross is our facilitator for the course and is also Manager of Cairns Youth Justice Service Centre. Our first session was well attended with 12 young people and we discussed the A, B and C of Anger and talked about slowing down our breathing when we feel our anger rising. Session 4 is on 7th June from 5.00 to 6.30pm and is about thinking ahead and the consequences of our choices.

Every Wednesday the Cairns Sexual Health team come up to Kuranda and conduct free testing for STIs; we have been out to the Amphitheatre, Kowrowa and had a BBQ in the park. The team give out free information and condoms as well as conducting the free tests. They are usually here between 9.30-12.00 at 36 Coondoo Street Kuranda.





# Asian Black-necked Stork (Jabiru to you)


A mate of ours was really thrilled recently to see a Jabiru in her backyard; unfortunately this thrill was tempered a little by seeing it standing in her fish pond nonchalantly gobbling up her lovingly nurtured goldfish, guppies and resident frogs.

The Asian Black-necked Stork, commonly referred to as the Jabiru, is Australia's only stork, and our largest wader. On his outrageously long red legs he stands up to 1.5 metres tall with a wing span of over two metres.

With his striking black and white colouring he is an impressive looking bird; curiously enough, the Black-necked Stork does not actually have a black neck, his neck being rather a mixture of iridescent blue, purple and green. Ah well, it looks black at a distance in low light, hence the misnomer.

The male member has brown eyes, and the female yellow eyes — otherwise the sexes are pretty much identical, although some observers believe that the male is slightly larger. Unusually, they do not have any calls other than a few grunts; most communication is by way of clapping and clattering their large, straight black bills.

It is not exclusively an Australian bird, but is found across New Guinea, South-East Asia and the subcontinent. Contrary to popular belief, the name 'Jabiru' is not an Australian indigenous word, but is most likely of Portuguese origin, and refers to a similar stork species resident of South America. An Australian Aboriginal word for the bird is generally thought to be "Karinji".





His preferred diet consists mainly of water creatures such as fish, crustaceans, eels and amphibians, but when this aquatic source is unavailable or scarce he will happily consume large insects such as grasshoppers, reptiles and other birds.

The Australian population of the Black-necked Stork is estimated to be about 10,000 birds. To put this in perspective, it is estimated that there are less than a thousand remaining throughout its South-East Asia range. Despite the optimistic outlook of the Australian stock of the bird, it is still evaluated as 'near threatened' by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), and is extinct in much of its previously common range throughout SE Asia. Without the substantial Australian abundance of the bird, it is reported that the IUCN would have classified the species as 'Endangered'.

Come breeding season (March to May), it is stork dance time, and following their elaborate mating waltz a platform nest of sticks and branches is built in a tree preferably over water in the floodplain or wetlands, where usually four eggs are produced. Only one or two chicks will survive. The same platform nest may be maintained and used for future years. It is thought that the birds will mate for life, remaining together throughout the non-breeding season. Both birds tend to the nest and the eggs, and the care of the hatched chicks.

Of course their biggest dangers are population growth, urban spread and climate change, and the associated destruction or reduction of wetland habitat, overfishing and pollution. Attempts in some southern Asian areas at reinvigorating the species have met with limited success, and it would certainly appear that the survival of the species is very dependent on the nurturing and maintenance of the Australian stock.

## "What was the question, again?"

Readers who are unable to hear the questions fired at politicians and other interviewees during TV newscasts may be interested in this reply one of our correspondents received from the ABC

"ABC News acknowledges how frustrating it is for its audience not to be able to clearly hear the questions from reporters at press conferences and events. While the ABC shares that frustration, regrettably there is little we can do within the limits of current technology.

"Politicians regularly call press conferences on short notice at a myriad of different locations. In this uncontrolled and uncontrollable environment, it is impossible for the venue to be miked for each and every questioner. The microphones are set up to clearly record the parliamentarian. It is rare that a venue will provide a mixed feed which includes the ability to hear the questions.

"By way of explanation, camera crews these days are usually just one person, the camera operator. Gone are

the days of sending a sound recordist as a matter of course. "They are now used only in circumstances where it

would be impossible to gather the story without two people and even then they may not be able to capture all the

"Because of this the camera operator is focussed on the job of getting the pictures and audio of the subject and feeding out the live signal.

"They are not physically capable of operating a boom mike which would be required to record the voices of reporters. While this is satisfactory for the main news bulletins which use edited packages containing only short "grabs", it is clearly not the best outcome for the TV News channels which all suffer from the same affliction. ABC News continues to search for a solution but so far it is not apparent."







We played round 2 of Intercity on Saturday May 6th with both our teams having a convincing win.







## Inside My Studio

**Interview and Photographs by Toni Rogers** 

Aukje Boonstra is a Tasmanian textile artist who recently made her second trip to Kuranda. Over each visit, Aukje has stayed in Cantata Studio, providing her artistic surroundings and studio space in which to work. She feels at home, and says "It is like coming home".

Well known for her eco-dyeing by many of the local artists, due to her workshops on her previous visit, Aukje was thrilled to be recognised in the village and greeted "Hello, you are the dyeing lady" by a stranger to her. Conversation commenced. *She thanks that Kuranda resident for making her feel so at home.* 

In the recent two-day workshop conducted at the CWA Hall, Aukje provided a much-needed guide to adopting a less-is-more mindset, valuing quality over quantity and bringing a meaningful and thoughtful approach to textile practices, including repurposing old textiles, repiecing fabrics and building up textures with stitch. Aukje's full time studio is at her home at Ulverstone on the north-west coast of Tasmania. In fact she has two studios - one inside with her worktables and sewing machine, and one outside with her dye pots, large worktable and dye shed.

Why are eco-dyeing, hand stitching and sewing her favourite media?

"I am fascinated by the natural dye process. What can be achieved simmering plant materials, cloth, water, some added rusty iron, pieces of copper and other metal based items is extraordinary. It is unpredictable and that fascinates me. You can never take a result for granted. It is such an ancient craft, so simple and basic. I love working with cloth. The way it softens and fades with wearing. The essence of the people who had it before and the known and unknown stories I can sense. I add my stories to it and give it another life."

Aukje uses natural dyes from local leaves and plants (including the notorious Singapore Daisy when she is in Kuranda) to produce colours in thread and fabric



that are in harmony with the environment. Most are collected on her daily walks in Ulverstone spent gathering leaves, barks, berries, seaweed and flowers.

#### If Aukje was not dyeing and stitching what would she be doing?

"Teaching remaking, mending, repairing and other basic skills to young people as I believe we need these skills in life and it is important to pass them on."

**NILS:** There are changes happening with the NILS program nationally. These changes are being implemented by Good Shepherd Microfinance with the program being remodeled into 'client support providers' and 'loan providers'. The funding available has reduced and the competitive tendering process will likely bring new players into the space.

This means that KNC may no longer be able to deliver NILS or at the very least, KNC will only do the 'front end' which is the loan application interview only.

We will no longer have a loan committee assessing, approving or rejecting loans nor will KNC manage the loan repayment process or any other follow up. This will be done by a third party – we are unsure where they will be located (it will not be in Kuranda and it may be interstate).

The changes will be implemented in the coming months. There will be no new NILS processed from 1st July 2017 until we know if we are being refunded for the front end. We apologise for the impact these changes may have on the Kuranda District, however it is outside our control.

## Tech Talk

#### **WITH THOMAS**

Having duplicated copies of your most important information keeps it safe in case anything goes badly wrong with your computer.

When you think about the many number of ways files can be lost unexpectedly, your view on the level of importance may change: computer crashes, virus infection, hard disk failure, physical computer damage, even theft. No matter why it is needed DATA BACKUP IS IMPORTANT!

One of the most painful experiences I have seen by far was a client regularly backing up what they thought was data to a USB drive, only to find too late they had actually only been backing up the shortcut icon of their MYOB for the past 5 years.

Thankfully, we managed to recover their files using very expensive specialist services!

**How best to backup?** It can be simple or complex, just ensure it is the most appropriate for your operational needs.

Consequential cons that go with each option to help you decide what is best for you:

- **1.** Local backup to another hard drive in the **PC:** Whilst data is certainly duplicated, this method really only offers protection against the failure of one of those hard drives. This method, however, may not protect you from virus infection, physical damage & theft.
- 2. Backup to a Network Drive or NAS within the Office: Whilst this does offer a sense of protection against problems directly associated with the PC itself, and hard drive failure, this is a common solution for most small businesses, but there is no protection against natural disaster such as fire, it offers limited protection against theft for example if devices are stolen during a break-in, and it is still within reach of virus & ransomware infection.

- **3. External Drive with Offsite Copy:** One of the most common options we see businesses follow in recent years and that is to have multiple backup drives, swapped daily or weekly, with one or more of those backup drives kept offsite (eg: business owner's or manager's home). These are a reliable backup method, however, are still at risk of data loss or damage if they are dropped, lost or stolen. The more backup sets you create the more secure your data will be particularly if you have a nasty virus infection or ransomware or physical loss such as a fire
- 4. Cloud Storage: For many this is an option that has been out of reach for several years as the quality of internet speed is still evolving. Most businesses are now or will very soon be on the NBN offering greater data speeds. Cloud storage is the method of storing your data (backups) on a remote server that is then mirrored to other services owned by such storage provider. Cloud storage is the MOST effective data backup solution, offering complete redundancy, encryption of data, and you have the flexibility to create your backup sets in any fashion you like monthly, daily, or even hourly – uploading changes to any files that have occurred since the last backup. In addition you can also specify to keep older backups from each previous month or week, so that once a month, or once weekly a whole new set of data is uploaded and the previous set archived. Cloud storage is certainly a marketable product nowadays and there are many options and features. My tips are to use one that offers encryption, unlimited storage, a friendly user interface, as well as accessibility from another source (web interface). In addition, a storage service geographically close to Australia will offer faster speeds, AND also, it is worth noting that if you run a company turning over more than \$2M



annually, you CANNOT use a cloud service outside of Australia under data retention laws. Personally I use CRASHPLAN (www.crashplan.com). It offers a 30 day FREE trial, has Australian based servers, offers unlimited storage, it's fully encrypted, gives me unlimited backup schedules options, and costs only \$69 per year for a single PC, or \$139 for up to 5 PC's on the same account. Crash plan also offers Apps for your smartphone or Tablets to access your data anytime! As you can see, there is no reason why any business or person with important data should not be backing up. Feel free to contact me if you need any assistance with backups for your home or business.

Now that the wet season is over, earthworks have commenced on the new Caravonica State School carpark. The carpark will have direct access to the school, 100 car spaces and dedicated bus stop and stop-drop-and-go area. The existing carpark on the opposite side of the Cairns Western Arterial Road will be removed along with the pedestrian lights which will increase the traffic flow before and after school.

Construction is now well underway on the new \$3.5 million Smithfield Fire and Rescue Station at Ainslie Place. The new facility will include a two-bay engine room, additional training facilities, office spaces, staff amenities, a recreation room, a covered road crash rescue training pad and ample storage space for equipment and supplies.

Following community concerns about pedestrian safety on the Captain Cook Highway at Clifton Beach I am happy to report that the Department of Transport and Main Roads will be installing traffic lights at the junction of the highway with Clifton Road. Two bus stops will also be relocated and the existing pedestrian refuge will be removed. This will provide a safer crossing for pedestrians and safer access for vehicles entering and exiting Clifton Road.

At the beginning of May I joined with the Treasurer Curtis Pitt to host a Labour Day Lawn Bowls fundraiser. Despite a light shower, we had a fantastic turn out with many touching up on their bowls skills. All funds raised went to the FNQ Suicide Prevention Taskforce.

The latest round of the Gambling Community Benefit Fund has resulted in a funding boost of more than a quarter of a million dollars to 10 Barron River community groups. If you belong to a not-for-profit community group you should consider applying for future rounds of the fund.





#### A Thought for June

HIS month we read a passage from St Matthews Gospel Chapter 9 verse 35 to Chapter 10 verse 8. Nothing we read in sacred scripture is merely about the past. The event in scripture, past though it may be, is also very much with us in the present. In scripture Jesus is speaking to us, not merely has spoken to people in the past.

In this passage Matthew has brought us to the point where Jesus realizes that the time has come to name those whose responsibility it will be to work with him on his mission. There is a hint (v 35) that the demands of that mission are getting beyond one pair of hands, even if those hands are the most loving and gracious hands

ever to touch this world.

We know that these people have already become disciples of Jesus (v 37). But now something more must be done. There needs to be an actual moment when these same disciples are given what the scripture calls authority (v 1).

This is not seen as an authority merely to give orders, which most of us like doing, but an authority to serve others, which we don't always like! Jesus then names the twelve, carefully and deliberately, and sends them out (v 51). What does this deceptively simple scene say to us?

As a Christian, each of us is part of the Body of Christ. But there must come a moment when we ourselves freely realize what this means.

We must own our baptism, and take responsibility



for it. The experience we call confirmation is meant to help us toward that, but in actual fact taking complete responsibility for our baptism may not come for a long time.

We are already disciples by our baptism, but have we fully realized what disciples do? In verse 35 we see what Our Lord's work is.

It is teaching, preaching, healing. We may not be called to do all these things. Teaching could be in many forms of handing on the faith, even if only to our own small children.

But we teach by being who we are. Healing can include any act of service to another or to society.

We are named. How? In baptism. But we need to hear Our Lord name us again. It can happen in many quiet and unexpected moments if we will only listen.

When we hear our name we will know what Our Lord wants us to do. Then, with his grace, we will be able to do it. That is the Good News for this week.

As Our Lord named his original disciples, so he names us to do his work in our time.



#### LATEST NEWS FROM KUR-WORLD

#### Masterplan

A few weeks ago we released the revised masterplan since some community members were eager to see it. However, please keep in mind that this revised master plan was a large-scale design showing how the development has been rearranged to accommodate environmental constraints and service needs (e.g. water, sewerage). This was not the final master plan. As with any project going through an EIS, planning is an iterative process. The masterplan will continue to be refined and become more detailed as more information becomes available. As successive masterplans are developed they will be released to the public.

#### **Environment**

Dry season fauna surveys started the last week of May. These surveys focus on the Northern Bettong (*Bettongia tropica*) and the Northern Quoll (*Dasyurus hullucatus*). Aquatic ecology surveys have been completed at sites on Haren, Owen and Warril Creeks within the property and results are being analysed. These surveys focused on sampling for aquatic invertebrates which are good indicators of the health of streams.

Freshwater fish surveys will be conducted once water levels in creeks have fallen a little more.

#### Water

Ground water pump tests will commence in the second week of June and if possible we would like to include monitoring of selected bores in the neighbourhood. If you are interested, please contact us so someone can visit and assess if your bore is suitable for monitoring.

#### **Community**

We have posted over 6000 feedback forms to residents of Kuranda, Koah, Speewah and Mareeba.

However, if you have a "no junk mail" sign on your postal box, Australia Post cannot deliver the form. If you would like a form posted to you, please email us your name and address.

This feedback form has been designed to capture all concerns and opportunities. This is part of our stakeholder engagement process and all answers will be recorded and analysed. This is a good opportunity for you to voice your concerns, ideas or support.

One of the members of the Community Reference Group has offered to make the letter box at his property available as a collection point for feedback forms. If you are a resident of Kuranda, the letter box is at 4 Warril Drive.

#### **Kuranda Pop-up Stall**

Members of the project team will continue to be available at Kuranda Foodworks fortnightly on Thursday afternoons (5:00 to 7:00 pm). These events have allowed us to record questions and concerns from local residents. Some of these questions and their answers are presented below.

#### Q&A

#### Where is access to the site coming from?

Different options are being considered, the preferred access is from the Kennedy Highway, the exact location is yet to be determined. Additional access may be provided to the site from Barnwell Road and an emergency access (gated) may be provided from Warril Drive.

#### How will power be provided?

Various power supply options and combinations are being investigated including solar arrays on buildings, methane production (sewerage treatment), as well as connections to Ergon's grid.

#### How will the sewerage be treated?

Currently, an onsite tertiary sewage treatment system is proposed, with recycled water used for non-potable applications across the site (such as irrigation of gardens).

## What will happen if Reever & Ocean gets approval and then walks away or sells in two years?

The EIS approval will only permit the construction of an integrated eco-resort. No other development is possible without a new application and approval process.

#### **Barnwell Farm Works**
