

An update of the Television
Black Spots Program.

A Federal Government initiative to improve Television Reception.

Background: The Federal government set aside \$35 million in 2000 from the partial sale of Telstra with the aim of eradicating between 200 to 250 black spot TV reception areas nationally. After some revisions of the guidelines for applications for communities to benefit from this program, it was decided to give funding to local councils to prepare application

it was decided to give funding to local councils to prepare applications on behalf of communities within their boundaries. Hence, the Mareeba Shire Council lodged several applications in October 2000, which included two for the Kuranda area, namely; Speewah and Top of the Range.

Our local Federal member, Warren Entsch has been very active in ensuring that residents in his electorate of Leichhardt will be beneficiaries of this program. He was successful in having the guidelines for the eligibility to apply changed from communities consisting at least 100 residents to communities consisting of at least 50 residents. He recognised that small remote communities would miss out if this was not changed. Warren and his staff have been, and continue to be supportive of our efforts to be successful in having reception upgraded.

Progress to date.

Applications lodged in October 2000 have been considered and the two in the Kuranda area have been included in those for upgrading. Where are we now?

Solutions to reception difficulties have proven to be much more complex than originally thought.

The major problem was to find enough available frequencies (or channels) to allow the re-transmission of programs in difficult reception areas and still have enough frequencies to be ready for 2004 when it is planned to continue broadcasting analogue signals as well as to simultaneously broadcast digital signals in the regional areas of the nation. This effectively doubled the demand for frequencies.

A technical solution was further complicated by the need to choose frequencies that would not interfere with existing transmissions from other transmitters in the far north already in operation, as well as for 2004 when digital transmission would commence operation from these existing sites.

Consultants were engaged by the federal government to come up with solutions to these problems.

Consultants recommendations for Speewah.

Mareeba Shire Council was given details of how it was proposed to solve this area's problems and told to proceed to seek tenders for the implementation of this these recommendations.

The recommendations included----

\*Channels 58, 61 and 64 can be assigned to provide re-transmission of the three UHF TV services (SBS, Sunshine (7), and WIN (9) in the Black Spot area in Speewah.

\*The site for re-transmission be at the Telstra Exchange on Speewah Road.

\*The polarisation of the signal to be horizontal from a 30 metre high tower

\*The proposed program source is off-air signals from Mt Bellenden-Ker.

When I was made aware of the recommendations, I requested the officer from council to ask Council to delay action in implementing the recommendations, as there were some concerns about whether the reception problems would be solved.

Concerns raised with Council.

**RAINFALL**

\*Some residents of the Speewah area have difficulty receiving both VHF (ABC & TEN) as well as UHF (SBS, 7 &9). As a result of this, if a solution is to be found it must include the re-transmission of all five free-to-air stations.

\*The Telstra Exchange site is not considered suitable if coverage is to extend to those residents who currently experience poor or no reception. Consideration should be given therefore to the siting of the re-transmission facility on the high area north-east of Speewah, which can be accessed from Windy Hollow Road (the old Kennedy Highway). This location was nominated by technical staff of the Cairns office of the Australian Communication Authority as being a suitable site for consideration.

Mareeba Shire Council's consideration and support.

Council supports the residents of Speewah who have concerns about the current solution to reception problems. The residents appreciate this support. Council has written to the instrumentalities of the Federal Government responsible for the project and have stated that they want to have further discussions with the residents of Speewah before they act on this matter.

They have pointed out the need to consider having all five free-to-air channels available and want a re-examination of the siting of a re-transmission facility.

Residents appreciation of the support of Mareeba Shire Council. Residents are keen to have a permanent solution to TV reception problems and Council shares their concern. The community may need to convince Council that some residents cannot receive VHF signals. Residents may soon be contacted by George Hudson who is keen to substantiate the existence of this problem and give Council written proof of these VHF blind spots.

Top of the Range solution.

Whilst it is recognised that Top of the Range residents have reception problems, it is attributable in part to the presence of dense vegetation which inhibits reception of the Saddle Mountain signals. Council has not yet received a report on possible solution of this area.

The meeting held in early March re whether the community at large wanted merchandise and goods displayed on footpaths resulted in a clear message going to Council that it did not.

# Youri Dreezen: healing his heart & fundraising.

A lively, dynamic 6 year old from Koah needs urgent medical assistance. Youri Dreezen was born in France on 30 January 1996. He has 2 sisters, Gaia, 13, and Freia, 10. All 3 children were home-born. His mother, Lizet Frijters, born in Belgium, is a multi-media artist and designer, who currently designs educational games about ecology. His father, Jos Dreezen, also born in Belgium, currently runs the eco-games business. All 3 children were born on small organic farm in the South of France. The family prefers natural medicine whenever possible.

The family arrived in Australia in 1998, applying for a temporary business visa in April 1999. The family is still uncertain about their immigration status and stay in Australia, as during the medical tests for the immigration process, Youri was found to have a

and a small hole in the heart. The cardiologists prefer urgent heart surgery their sympathy, and you will find donation points in and around Kuranda to avoid complications and possible further damage to Youri's heart and soon. the lungs. The family has no Medicare, as medicare is only available for permanent residents and citizens.

Youri, an otherwise healthy, happy boy, will have his operation organised



as soon as the funds are available through fundraising by his family and friends. In the mean time, the parents keep trying different approaches of energetic healing. Jos and Lizet believe acting on the mind could possibly influence the function of the body, and hope to improve Youri's health this way.

The costs of the operation at Prince Charles Hospital in Brisbane is about \$20,000 for surgery, hospital, accommodation, and transport to Brisbane. \$2500 has already been spent on medical expenses, but due to the family's limited income, they need help. Body & Mind healing to alleviate the side-effects of the open-heart surgery or to possibly heal Youri before operation are estimated at around \$2000.

Funding for the surgery and other expenses and Body and Mind healing is being organised with the help of the local Lions Club. Donations can

The library's cool, comfortable and relaxed atmosphere make this the ideal hideaway to curl up with a book, listen to music, or read the paper.



# A Thought for Easter

This month we open our Bibles to St Johns Gospel Chapter 20 and read verses 1 to 18. As we read we realise that we are in the company of a very courageous woman. What she did was both dangerous and frightening, and what she sees dismays her. The tomb is open and the body is gone. Her first instinct is to tell the other disciples. Two of them come and they too realise the body is gone. One of them leaps to the truth. The Lord is risen!

Mary is still searching frantically in the area. She meets a man she does not see clearly in the early dawn. Her response to his enquiry about her tears is to plead for the body she is seeking. The man guietly says her name and in that moment Mary knows she need look no further. She moves instinctively to hold him but he moves gently from her. Once again Mary seeks the other disciples. This time there is no cry of distress, only a statement so profound and significant it can be said only in the simplest words. Mary says "I have seen the Lord."

What does this moment in this woman's life say to us today? She came "while it was yet dark." As we in the early years of the third millennium seek for Jesus it is in many senses a dark time. In many circles it takes courage to acknowledge being a Christian. Sometimes the search is not easy. Jesus can seem to be no longer part of the world we

live in [v 2]. If that feeling becomes strong in us we should do what Mary did, go for help. Join a group of others who are searching for him and for what he might mean in their lives [v 3]. Someone will take you further on the search than you can go yourself, someone whose vision is clearer, whose intuition richer,

Others can help but we must continue to search [v 11]. For Mary there comes an ironic moment. She doesn't know Jesus when she meets him as the Risen Lord [v 15]. We may be searching in our life for something lost, something we presume dead. Perhaps it is faith itself, perhaps a love lost, perhaps a lost sense of fulfilment about our job. We need to realize that the first question we might ask is "Why?". Asking that "why?" may be the moment Our Lord can meet us again.


Our Lord told Mary she could not hold him [v 17]. We cannot hold faith in Our Lord as a private possession. We need, as Mary did, to share him in community with others. There is another sense in which Jesus refuses to be our prisoner. Instead he grows and changes endlessly, and, as he does, he calls us to grow and change in our relationship with him. If we are prepared to follow him he will uphold us in the growing which he demands. That is the Good News for Easter.

# FROM LITTLE THINGS BIG THINGS GROW

## WE NEED SEEDS PLEASE

In order to get forest established as quickly as possible in the EnviroLink Wildlife Corridor (to the west of Kuranda, stretching from Greenforest, Kowrowa, to Speewah), we want to plant fast-growing native trees, that is, pioneer species. By doing this, tree canopy is formed in just a few years, helping to shade out weeds and creating the right environment for many other forest species to grow. The aim is to get a good mixture of trees (diversity) in the long term.

The trees we need are generally good seeders and we can propagate all the trees we want in our nursery from seeds collected. Your assistance to collect seeds would help enormously. The species are are seeking are: Omalanthus (Bleeding Heart)

Grevillea baileyana (Findlay's Silky Oak)

Aleurites moluccana (Candle Nut)

Elaeocarpus bancroftii (Kuranda Quandong)

Elaeocarpus augustifolius (Blue Quandong)

Nauclea orientalis (Leichhardt Tree)

"Prince Phillip asked me if I picked the flowers myself! I said no and bowed at the Prince as he walked past." By George Bong



# Recipe of the Month

Stir Fry Ingredients

## WHAT'S COOKIN?

Recently, I was asked for a couple of dishes that would be suitable to serve up to people who had coeliac disease. Coelic disease is the result of a permanent intolerance to gluten (found in wheat, rye, barley, triticale and oats). Considering that the larger proportion of packaged foods seem to contain one or more of the offending ingredients, preparing tasty meals can be very thought provoking at times. Perhaps these gluten free treats will ring in a

Pumpkin and Zucchini Pie (serves 4)

3/4 cup rice 1 1/2 cups hot water 3 eggs, lightly beaten 20g rice flour 1 cup skim milk 1 tbl parsley, chopped 6og reduced-fat seasonings to taste cheese, grated

2 cups chopped vegetables (zucchini, pumpkin, broccoli, capsicum)

Place rice and hot water in microwave, cook in High for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Stand for 5 minutes. Use fork to blend 1 egg, parsley and pepper into the rice. Press mixture against base and sides of a 23cm microwave and oven-proof pie plate. Arrange vegetables in the rice case, cover with plastic wrap and microwave on High for 5 minutes or till vegetables are tender.

Whisk remaining eggs into rice flour, one at a time till smooth. Add milk and seasonings. Pour mixture

into rice crust and sprinkle with cheese. Bake pie in a moderate oven (18oC) for 45 minutes or till set. Serve warm or cool. Note: the pie crust can be used as a base other pies quiches frittatas.

## **Apple Rice Tart** with Sauce

(serves 6)

2 cups cooked white medium grain rice

2 tbl castor sugar

1 tbl gluten-free custard powder 2 eggs, lightly beaten 1 tsp ground cinnamon 410g can pie apples 1 tsp mixed spice 1/2 cup cream

- 3. Offer empathy, not sympathy. Try to see life from the person's point of view. 4. Ask about suicide. Be direct. Don't be embarrassed. Talk openly about the suicide. Mentioning suicide will not give them the idea.
- 5. Be willing to listen. Reflect and accept feelings. Offer hope. Do not deny the depth of their feelings.
- 6. Be non-judgemental. Don't lecture on the value of life or argue how much they might have going for them.

- 7. Don't dare, ridicule, or use guilt to try to prevent suicide.
- 8. Stay with them, until you get help, or someone else to help you.
- 9. Focus on handling one hour / day / problem at a time. Suicidal people feel
- overwhelmed by their problems. 10. Help identify supportive people and family and friends. A suicidal person often perceives they have no support.
- 11. Don't act shocked. This will put distance between you. The suicidal person needs to feel understood.
- 12. Don't be sworn to secrecy. Involve significant others. Confidentiality does not apply to suicide.
- 13. Generate hope that a better solution can be found. Focus on strengths. Explore alternative solutions.
- 14. Ask what has to be different for the suicidal person to choose life instead of
- 15. Remember take action. Remove weapons. Get help or go with the person for help.

Recipe for this month: quick and easy

For the crust: 1 cup unbleached white flour 1/2 cup whole wheat flour Pinch sea salt 1/4 cup safflower oil

6 tbl apple juice

**PUMPKIN PIE** For the filling:

4 cups pumpkin puree 2 tbl safflower oil 2 tbl arrowroot 1/2 cup apple juice 1/4 cup tahini

filling cont. 1/4 cup honey 1/2 tsp ginger powder

pinch sea salt 1 tsp cinnamon 1/2 tsp nutmeg 1/2 cup chopped nuts for garnish


Step 1: make the crust.

Sift both unbleached white & whole wheat flour with sea salt. Rub in oil until the flour forms small balls. Pour cold apple juice over flour and press together until the dough forms one ball.

Knead gently for 1-2 minutes and then refrigerate for half an hour. Roll out on waxed paper 4 cm larger than the pie dish. Fit crust onto oiled pie dish, tuck over edges and pinch

Step 2: the filling.

Wash one small pumpkin, peel and cut into cubes( removing all seeds). Oil a baking tray and cook the pumpkin at 180 until soft( about 40 minutes). Transfer to a bowl. Dissolve arrowroot in apple juice. Blend with tahini, honey, sea salt and spices. Puree pumpkin and the above mixture in batches, adding more juice if needed, to make a thick pumpkin puree. Fill the pie crust with pumpkin puree and smooth down. Bake at 180 for 45 minutes, then garnish with chopped and walnuts and brush with honey. Allow to cool. Serves 8-10

For Wing8/Me/XP (Home and Pro) A Batch file for Defraging. Just run NotePad, and enter one line into a new file:

defrag c:

Save the file and name it "defrag c.bat" or any similar, obvious name ending in ".bat". You then can click on the file to manually trigger a defrag of C:. or you can use Task Scheduler to run the batch file whenever you want, such as late at night.

If you have other drives, you can either defrag them via separate batch files (a "defrag d.bat" file would contain just the line "defrag d:" for example), or you can enter the lines serially into one batch file.

I have a file called "defrag\_all.bat" for example, and it contains these lines:

defrag c:

defrag d:

defrag e: defrag f:

When run, defrag\_all.bat defrags the drives one after the other.

As part of your daily maintenance routine, Run RegClean 4.1a. This is Microsoft's free and simple Registry cleaner; it scans neither wide nor deep, but it will pick up some types of common errors. And as a nice touch, it give you a one-click Undo option so you can put things back the way they were, if you need to. (I've never needed to do this, but it's nice to know it's there.) You can download RegClean from most popular download sites (such as http://www.zdnet.com/downloads/stories/info/ o,,oooE3I,.html ), and you may be able to get it from the Microsoft site. (I say "may" because Microsoft has a love/hate relationship with RegClean, and periodically pulls it from their site. Eventually, when enough people complain, they put it back.

The problem with using "live" disk-based space for permanent storage of backups is that anything that can eat the data on the first disk--or partition--- can eat the data on the other. It could be a worm or virus, a software error, or a bad hardware problem that causes both disks to crash. Even outside-the-box problems can ruin this kind of backup: fire, flood, a sprinkler malfunction,

lightning or power spike, etc etc etc: For that matter, there's also theft: If someone walks off with your system, you're completely out of luck because they get the backups, too.

Yes, these are low-probability events, so it oils down to "how safe do you want to be?" If you keep essential business records on your PC, or use your PC for taxes, online banking and the like, I think the best answer is "as safe as possible." To be \*really\* safe, you need to get your backups out of the same box where your live, in-use data resides--preferably moved to a completely separate location, so anything that takes out the PC won't affect the backups, and vice versa.

Of course, if there's nothing valuable on your system, and you don't mind spending the time it takes to rebuild your PC after a major problem, then the extra-safe backup method may not be needed.

But I find that most people have at least \*some\* things on their PCs they'd hate to lose, or have to recreate. That's why I think a reliable, safe backup system that's physically and logically separate from your PC is really the best approach.





# **Red-necked Crakes**

This is a fairly widespread but very secretive species that lives in the rainforests of Far North Queensland, as well as in New Guinea, and is sometimes seen in wooded suburban gardens adjacent to the forest. Cats in the suburbs do oring them in occasionally, as our local vets can testify, and 1 have also seen them as roadkill on the range road. The hot and humid weather this summer has delayed their breeding this season, as over the past couple of years we have been seeing young from the first brood in December, with a second brood in February during 200 1.

We were getting worried, as despite the usual pre-wet season calling in November, there was no sign of any young. That was the case until Feb 24 2002, when 1 heard the distinctive high bitched shrilling calls from within a dense flower bed, and was able to watch the adult pair coming in to feed them on worms and grubs. This pair nere also have a great liking for cheese, 1 guess the high fat content is to their liking, and they will readily come to take it.

There are 3 youngsters this time, we have seen up to 5 at once in previous years but 3 or 4 seem more the norm. These birds were not newly natched, as the very new ones are about the size of an animated table tennis ball with little stick

logs, and these are clearly a fair bit larger than that, though less than a week old I'd say. They are a sort of fluffy matt greyish plack, with black legs and eyes, though the pill has small whitish patches at the base of the centre part of the upper mandible, edged with black at the sides and with a median dividing line. The pin feathers of the primaries are just barely showing, and their fluffy stumpy tails are flicked upwards as they walk, just like the habit of the adults.

They are quite vocal and you can near them shrilling at close range, the

sound only travelling a few metres, whilst the adults have a quiet grunting which seems to be a sort of contact call to keep the group together. Threats to the babies here would include snakes and monitors, though last year we did get 3 up to being fully fledged, disappearing after a cyclone. There are two pairs which have our house as a part of their ranges, which may actually overlap, as one set seem much shyer and less confiding than the others. The Brush-turkeys chase them unmercifully and try to steal their food, and Spotted Catbirds have been seen to have a go at such piracy as well.

Everyone gets out of the way of the Cassowaries though, with the three 6 month old chicks now colouring up, with bluish starting to appear on their heads. Father is very patient with them, a sort of model parent, and lets them grab almost all the food, only taking an occasional morsel for himself and even letting them pull it out of his beak at times! They are ravenous at present as fruit seem scarce in the forest, maybe due to dry weather, plus the chicks are now large and have typical teenage appetites.

Threadworms are tiny parasitic worms which commonly infect children in this area. They are by far the most common of the parasitic worms and are fortunately easily controlled. There are, however, a few misconceptions about them and how they are spread.

Threadworms can live only in people, not in pets or wildlife. The adult worms live in the intestinal system and lay their eggs on the exterior of the anus. They are then transferred back to the mouth by nands or, in some cases, clothing or bedding. This is why washing the hands after going to the toilet is so important.

The worms or eggs cannot be transmitted by bandicoots, wallabies or other wildlife, or via their droppings.




